The ride's theme is “**Together we can do anything.**” The Siepker family is embarking on this adventure in gratitude for support received on behalf of Jeff who experiences Monosomy 9P (otherwise known as Alfi's Syndrome or 9P-), a rare chromosome anomaly.

Jeff and Mark's trip begins July 11; they will ride approximately 70 miles from Omaha to Blanchard, Iowa via the Wabash Trace. After driving to Clinton, Mo., they will ride the Katy Trail 225 miles to St. Charles (a suburb of St. Louis), arriving on July 18.
